- While watching TV program in 4:3 size mode for a long time, there would. be traces on the edge of the screen's left, right and center parts because of different transmition of the light on the screen. Similar impact on the screen will occur when playing DVD or connecting games control. Products destroyed by these reasons can't be guaranteed for maintenance.
- It might cause picture remnants to display electronic games and motionless . picture of PC more than a period of time. To avoid such effect, please decrease the "contrast" and "brightness" when displaying motionless picture.

• Place the TV on a firm and flat surface, leaving a space of at lease 10cm around the set and 30cm from the top of the set to the wall or cabinet. Ensure the TV is positioned close to the wall to avoid it falling when pushed.



• When you turning the TV set, do not hold the top side of the TV set, you should hold the bottom side.



• When you lifting the TV set, do not use one hand to handle it, you should lift the TV set by two hands.

- 9 P.MODE: Select the picture Mode.
- 10. TXT: Enter or exit teletext.
- 11. FAV.LIST: Favorite channel list.
- Or MIX (under TXT): setting transparency.
- 12. RECORD:DTV mode record data USB disk.
- 13. SUBTITLE:DTV mode select subtitle mode.
- Or SIZE (under TXT): setting sizes of the character. 14. AUDIO: Select TV audio mode. Or CANCEL (under TXT): cancel the TXT on screen.

- ① Open the back lid of the remote control.
- (2) Install two 7#(AAA)1.5V batteries. Ensure the correct polarity of the batteries.
- ③ Cover the back lid. Please take out of the batteries from the remote control for long time of no use.

If the remote control doesn't work properly, please carry out the following checks.

- Check the TV is turned on.
- Check the polarity of the batteries are correct.
- Check the batteries are not drained.
- Check the power supply is normal or the power cord is correctly connected.
- Check there are no special fluorescent light or neon light around.

2. Basic Operation

2.1 Power ON/OFF(optional)

- Connect the power cord to the **AC input**. Insert the power cord into the appropriate socket.
- Press the **Power switch** to switch on the TV, then press **Power** button to turn on the unit.
- Press the Power switch again to switch off the TV.
- Note: After switch off the TV, please don't immediately re-open the power switch ,should be delayed one minute more to re-open the power switch.

2.2 Setting of Standby Mode

- Press (\bigcirc) button to turn on the unit.
- Press (U) button again to return the display to standby mode. The power indicator turns red.
- Be sure not to set your TV in standby mode for a long period of time.



3. INPUT SOURCE

- Press SOURCE to show input source list.
- Press ▲/▼ to select and ENTER to confirm.
- The menu will be automatically hidden in a few

seconds, or press EXIT to clear on-screen menu.

4. Menu Function Description

4.1 CHANNEI MENU

- The channel menu is available only in DTV mode.



4.1.1 AUTO TUNING

- Auto Tuning can find out all effective channel automatically.
- Press ▲/▼ to select Auto Tuning, then press ENTER to start auto searching.
- If you want to stop searching, press EXIT, and press ◀ to confirm or ► to cancel.

4.1.2 ATV MANUAL TUNING

- Manual Tuning can search up or down, and will pause when find a channel.
- Press ◀ to search down from the current frequency, and press ► to search up.



4.1.3 PROGRAMME EDIT



There are four shortcut keys for programming the channel.

Frist press $\mathbf{\nabla}/\mathbf{A}$ to highlight the channel, then:

- Delete: Delete the channel.

- **Rename:** Enter rename state, then press ◀/► to select the word you want to change, and

press $\mathbf{\nabla} / \mathbf{A}$ to select a character. (Only for ATV mode)

- **Move:** Set the channel to moving state then press **▼**/**▲** to move it to the position you want.

Skip: Skip the selected channel. (Your TV set will skip the channel automatically when using CH+/-)
 ENTER: Press to confirm.

- Menu: Press to return to previous menu.

- Key Lock: To select Off or On.
- Hotel Mode: To select Off or On.





4.6 SETUP MENU

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8. Simple Troubleshooting

If the displayfails or theperformance changes dramatically, check the display in accordance with the following instructions. Remember to check the peripherals to pinpoint the source of the failure.

The remote control does not function properly.	 -Check the batteries are not drained.(Use new batteries.) -Check that the remote control is within the operating range. -Check that the remote control is pointed to the remote control window on the display. -Check that there are no obstacles between the remote control and the remote control window.
Flashing spots or stripes appear on the screen.	-Check that there are no emission (Car, HV cable or Neon lamp) orother possible interferencesources.
Image colour orquality deteriorates.	 -Check that all the video settings are adjusted appropriately, such as brightness, contrast, colour etc. -For more information about video settings, refer to OSD Functions in Chapter 2.
Screen position and size are incorrect.	-Check that the screen position and size is adjusted appropriately.
